MEDICATION FORM

If your child requires any medication(s) in school, have your child's MD complete a Medication Administration Form (located on the PVC Nurse website).

- Provide the completed <u>Medication Administration Form</u> along with a pharmacy labeled bottle
 of the matching medication to the school nurse in August.
- A Medication Administration Form is required for both over the counter medications (such as Advil, Tylenol, cough drops, eye drops, etc.) as well as prescription medications.
- The Medication Administration Form needs to be signed and stamped by the healthcare prescriber. A parent / guardian also need to complete and sign the form.
- The Medication Administration Form needs to be completed annually for each school year.
- Students are not permitted to bring medication to / from school without MD written permission to do so and school nurse approval.

STUDENTS WITH SEVERE ALLERGIES AND/OR SIGNIFICANT MEDICAL ISSUES

If your child has a severe allergy or a significant medical condition, please notify the school nurse and have your child's physician complete a <u>Medication Administration Form</u> and an <u>Emergency Care Plan</u>.

- Please provide this to the nurse along with the corresponding medication in August.
- These forms can be found on the PVC Nurse website.
- The Medication Administration Form also needs to be signed by a parent.
- Emergency Care Plan forms for food allergies, bee sting allergies and seizure disorders can be found on the PVC Nurse website in the forms section.
